EXPERT WITNESS

2023

Mendoza v SYSCO. Superior Court of the State of Arizona in and For the County of Maricopa Case No. CV2022-003007. Expert Witness in Architecture for Plaintiff. Developed exhibits and prepared an Incident Assessment Report demonstrating Defendant's inadequate vehicular path design and subsequent failure to provide protective devices adjacent to a truck loading dock, which contributed to the death of a landscape worker. Case was settled in favor of the Plaintiff.

Marina Cortez Inc. v Hankins Corporation; Superior Court of the State of California Case No. 37-2014-00023977. Expert Witness in Architecture for Plaintiff, testifying to Defendant's failure to properly complete construction work and Defendant's unethical invoicing to artificially inflate construction costs. Case was settled in favor of the Plaintiff.

Thaddeus Pritchett v Picnic Point Homeowners Association; Superior Court of the State of Washington in the County of Snohomish Case No. 10-2-08134-6. Expert Witness in Architecture and View Impingement for Plaintiff, testifying to testifying to and clearly demonstrating the lack of significant view impingement by the Plaintiff's proposed single-family second-story addition. Case was decided in favor of the Plaintiff.

2002

Carl D. Alexander and Edwin D. Tuttle and Tod McClaskey Jr., et al City of Port Angeles, Ehm Architecture, Port of Port Angeles and State of Washington Department of Ecology; Washington State Shoreline Hearings Board Case Nos. 02-027 & 02-028. Expert Witness in Architecture and View Impingement for Respondents (including witness' architectural firm), testifying to and clearly demonstrating the lack of significant view impingement by the witness' proposed waterfront hotel development, and contesting the Shoreline Hearings Board (SHB)'s jurisdiction beyond their clearly-defined jurisdiction of 200' to Mean High High Water Mark. Case was decided in favor of the Respondents with respect to view impingement, setting precedent for all coastal development in Washington State. Further, SHB voted 5-1 to limit its jurisdictional reach to only the defined area, and not the entirety of projects that had a portion of their premises within that jurisdiction as previously interpreted by SHB.

Plaintiff Unknown v A.M. Fathy Construction; Superior Court of the State of California in the County of San Diego Case No. Unknown. Expert Witness in Architecture for Defendant, testifying to refute Plaintiff's claims of construction defects by Defendant. Case was decided in favor of the Defendant.
